THOUGHTS FOR THE WEEK

What We Believe #32

The Bible says in I John 1:7, "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin." The apostle is writing to Christians urging them to continue to "walk in the light." He is encouraging them to remain loyal in their walk with God. Based on their faithfulness, they would continue in fellowship with God. Further, the blood of Christ would continue to cleanse them from any sin they commit. This passage assures the child of God of forgiveness based on their continued allegiance to God. Notice, however, that this continued cleansing is conditional. The apostle uses the term "if" to convey that unless one continues to "walk in the light," he cannot expect to remain in fellowship with God. The Christian must continue to live in obedience to God's word or else forfeit their relationship with God. One cannot expect God to continue to forgive when one is no longer living in harmony with divine demands.

It is possible for a child of God to choose to no longer live a godly life. This person may have obeyed the gospel and thus received initial cleansing from their sins by the blood of Christ. They further may have continued to live as a Christian for a period of time. As long as they were faithful ("walking in the light"), they were assured of the continuous cleansing of their sins. They remained in a saved condition. But upon ceasing to remain loyal to God, that gracious forgiveness they once enjoyed is no longer extended. They have now "fallen away from grace" (Gal. 5:4). They have "fallen away from the living God" (Heb. 3:12). They have "fallen away from the faith" (1 Tim. 4:1). These verses are in the Bible to convey that unless one remains loyal in their walk with God, they forfeit their relationship with the heavenly Father. If one does apostatize, one must be "restored" back to their former relationship with God through repentance and prayer (Gal. 6:1; Acts 8:20-24). If an apostate refuses to be restored, then they remain in a lost condition until they repent of their forsaking God. Yes, one who was once saved and a child of God could indeed spend eternity in hell if they do not continue to be faithful. Don't accept the religious teaching of "once saved, always saved." This doctrine is not biblical. It offers a false assurance of salvation that minimizes the importance of remaining faithful to the Savior. The child of God is assured of continued cleansing by the blood of Jesus only if one continues to walk in the light. One must be "faithful unto death" in order to receive the heavenly crown (Rev. 2:10). Don't be deceived into thinking otherwise.
