THOUGHTS FOR THE WEEK

What We Believe #33

When I teach that the doctrine of "once saved, always saved" is unscriptural, people often respond that the saved would never forsake God. Sometimes they respond by telling me that God would never forsake his people. When people tell me such things, I know immediately they have not spent enough time reading the Bible. At least on this topic they are ignorant. The words of Jesus have come to pass: "You do greatly err, not knowing the Scriptures." For those interested, I urge you to open your own Bible to 2 Chronicles 24:20 and read where the priest Zechariah confronted King Joash and the Lord's people with the sin of apostasy. The priest states: "Because you have forsaken the Lord, he [the Lord] has forsaken you." Note that God's people can forsake him by refusing to live in harmony with the divine will. When this happens, the Lord forsakes them as well. Passages like this do not harmonize with the doctrine of "impossibility of apostasy" or "once saved, always saved." Somebody's doctrine is wrong, and it is not the Bible.

Whereas we have the assurance that God will not arbitrarily forsake the faithful child of God (Heb. 12:5), it must be appreciated that God does not override a person's free moral agency. God created human beings as creatures of choice; He made us with the ability to make choices and gave us the responsibility of making the right choice. When we make the wrong choices, we suffer the consequences. From the time of Adam and Eve onward, human beings have often made the tragic choice to no longer follow God; thus forfeiting their relationship with the heavenly Father. God drove Adam and Eve from Eden when they rejected his will. It is no different today. Even among God's people, there are those who often choose to no longer serve the Master. They forsake God. They turn their back on God. Often these people fall into lives of sin and immorality. When this happens, God forsakes them as well. Certainly, the Lord desires them to return and seek forgiveness in compliance with the divine will. But if rebellious men do not choose to do so, they will remain lost and ultimately suffer eternal punishment. King Joash was such a person. He murdered Zechariah the priest, "and you know that no murderer has eternal life in him" (1 John 3:15). I plead with all to reject the erroneous doctrine of "once saved, always saved." This error offers false hope with false assurance. Do not allow yourself to be deceived into believing it.
