THOUGHTS FOR THE WEEK

What We Believe #36

The Old Testament contains many stories of how God's once faithful children decided to forsake the Lord. One example is in 2 Chronicles 26, where King Uzziah "did what was right in the eyes of the Lord." However, as he became more powerful, "his pride led to his downfall" and "he was unfaithful to the Lord his God." The priests confronted him by saying, "You have been unfaithful and you will not be honored by the Lord God" (26:4, 16-18). Here is a case of someone who was obedient to the Lord earlier in their life. Later, however, this individual made the conscious decision to no longer do what was right in the eyes of the Lord. The Bible says this led to Uzziah's downfall. The scriptures further state that he became unfaithful to the Lord. Notice here that a child of God can become unfaithful to God. When the king was confronted by the priests, they made it clear that as long as he continued in his disobedience, the Lord would not honor him as king or consider him as faithful. God no longer extends his merciful forgiveness to one who deliberately chooses to live in rebellion to the divine will. The biblical record closes without ever indicating that Uzziah repented of his sinful course. The king had chosen a life that resulted in apostasy and tragically died in that lost condition.

How might this biblical narrative be used today to teach a spiritual lesson? Answer: It teaches us that God creates us as creatures of choice. He gives us the ability to make choices and the responsibility of making the right choices. God allows people the choice of whether or not they want to be his children. And, even after one becomes a child of God, one must continue to exercise that freedom of choice to remain faithful. God will allow a person to refuse to follow him, albeit with tragic consequences. Christians today can decide to turn their back on God, and many often do. They forsake God. They fall away. They apostatize. God does not desire this, but he allows it because he respects our freedom of choice. Like Uzziah, the child of God today can become unfaithful. If they continue in that lost state until death (without repentance and restoration, Gal. 6:1), they will be lost in eternity. Please reject the false doctrine of "once saved, always saved." This teaching of the "impossibility of apostasy" is not from God. It offers false security and assurance. One must be faithful to receive the crown of life at the end of life's way (Rev. 2:10).
